INCREASE ACCOUNTABILITY

- Focus on impact over activity

SHARE POWER

- Devolve decision making
- Robust social infrastructure
- No one sector has more power than another

- Increasingly working in consortia
- Always making room for new organisations/people
- Having the difficult conversations

- Co-operative governance structures that don't depend on an organisation
- Increased innovation by civil society
- Public systems supporting collective activity
- Transparent decision making and financial reporting
