


What is a Community Benefit Society (CBS)?



Key features of a CBS

- Legal name for a limited community-led membership organisation
- Must be entirely for the benefit of the community
- Registered under the Co-operative and Community Benefit Societies Act 2014
- Operate on a 'one-member, one-vote' principle

How can BD_Collective CBS benefit our community?

- Opportunity for CBS to hold & manage contracts and commissions
- Representation for member organisations of all sizes, equity through one member one vote
- Neutral ground for visibility, sharing access and power across members and networks





What most appeals to people about joining a CBS?

- Access to collaborative bids
- Developing relationships
 with other organisations
- Sharing experiences and good practices

Where do people care most about transparency in the CBS?

- Developing grant proposals
- Governance and leadership
- Monitoring, evaluation & learning

What should the CBS focus on to best support its members?

- Fundraising and income generation
- Networking with external organisations
- Facilitating collaboration
 between members

We think there are 3 common themes that point towards a starting point for what the CBS might look like.

Social Infrastructure Contract

- BD Giving holding contract on behalf of CBS
- Facilitate development of BD_Collective CBS into selfgoverning organisation that can take over this contract as well as other projects
- 3 year contract, £300,000
- Continue to:
 - Develop networks
 - Collaborative joint funding bids as a CBS
 - Engage members through digital platforms, events and activities




Neighbourhood Networks

- Contract sign-off imminent
- Two years, £760,000
- Up to 10 hyperlocal Neighbourhood Networks (NN)
- Residents and community-led solutions to improve quality of life + tackle health inequalities

- Convened by BD_Collective with two tenders submitted
- Awaiting outcome







Criteria for CBS Working Group

- 6 to 8 individuals
- Six months period
- Prepare CBS for membership launch
- Support development of governance structure
- Review priorities for Board
- Time compensated
- Applications open until Monday, 7 April 2025
- Interviews on 16 and 17 April 2025







Deliverables Timeline

Year 1 (Sep '24 - Aug '25)

Develop CBS including governance structure, recruitment and principles of the CBS

Continuous support of existing networks

Development of a 'collaboration framework' adopted and used by local networks.

Improve trust and transparency, promote learning through data and case studies

Support emergence of new networks

CBS launch event, promoting opportunities for organisation and recruiting members

Annual in-person events for sharing, learning, onboarding new orgs

Develop governance skills and knowledge. Create collaborative approaches to boards, with a target to improve the number of small organisations sitting on large organisations boards

Increase number of collaborations developed by network members using the collaboration framework.

Provide VCSE representation at relevant boards and committees + Widening the pool of organisations representing the CBS

Continue supporting the Neighbourhood Networks (localities) programme with statutory partners

Facilitate more joint funding bids

Building number of joint bids via CBS membership and track through amount of money coming into B&D

Support local networks to build sustainable collaborations to support residents

Develop collaboration between civil society groups and between the sector and partners

Provide representation of the local VCSE sector with the council and other partners

Lead the sector to stimulate new opportunities in the borough
